Our role is to reach out to families and listen to your concerns and opinions about all SEND services in Cumbria, from EHCP issues to diagnosis processes & concerns about therapy! Armed with this Parent Carer feedback, SENDAC attends meetings & events with the Local Authority, NHS professionals, as well as, other professional SEND bodies. SENDAC are an equal statutory partner and therefore, this allows us to voice your opinion to the people who can make a difference!

Then together we can change and improve SEND services across Cumbria, with your opinions behind every decision throughout the process, also known as co-production. SENDAC are the parent voice of Cumbria, we make sure your voice is at the heart of every decision.

Working In coproduction with these professionals has enabled parent carers to have a voice that is so desperately required for SEND services in Cumbria. We are currently working on areas such as EHCPs, sensory processing, the autism diagnosis pathway, the autism in schools project and so much more.

The healthy parent carer course is a programme for parents and carers to help them with their mental health and to learn how to put themselves first! Last year we asked Parents across Cumbria what training they would like the most, the first three picked by parents and carers were makaton, sensory processing and Healthy parent carer training. We have hosted two sessions of sensory training and two sessions of Makaton level 1 training, delivered to over 130 parent carers in Cumbria! We are so excited that we have now paid for two of our SENDAC reps to be trained to deliver the healthy parent carer programme to parents in Cumbria! They will have completed their training by March 2024 and we are so EXCITED that we will be able to deliver this to parents!





Key Updates on some of our current work





Our SENDAC Representatives attend various meetings with professionals in the NHS, Local authorities and other SEND services such as SENDIASS and short break providers. Some of these meetings are specific targeted groups, which have been set up in order to improve particular SEND services, processes or policies. For example, Improving transport to school for SEND families, improving the support available for children and young people with FASD, or improving the Autism diagnosis process.

These targeted meetings are called 'work streams' and they take place regularly. The professionals who attend these meetings are the most appropriate professionals to help with the current topic being discussed. some of these may include:

- Educational psychologists (Local Authority)
- speech and language therapists (NHS)
- occupational therapists (NHS)
- Parents and carers of children and young people with additional needs (Expert by experience)
- SEND managers (Local Authority)
- Social workers (Local Authority)
- SENDIASS officers
- EHCP Coordinators (Local Authority)
- SEND communication and engagement officers (Local Authority)
- SEND Partnership manager (Local Authority)
- commissioner's

In these meetings, the role of SENDAC is to ensure that we bring parent carer opinions on the particular topic, into the discussions that take place and the decisions that get made. For example in the meeting, we may be discussing the EHCP process. Lots of parents may have told SENDAC that they would like to have an 'EHCP pack' at the start of the process to inform them of what will happen. SENDAC Will voice those opinions in the meeting and we will decide together whether it is possible, taking into account realistic financial and capacity constraints. If the professionals disagree SENDAC will openly challenge them on this. We will then all work together to create a pack using all of our expertise to design it.

The work streams we choose to go on are based on our parent priorities which we analyse through our yearly parent carer priority survey, which is sent out to our membership as well as feedback we have received throughout the year.

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Key Updates on some of our current work









The autism pathway



We are currently ensuring consistency across the county, making sure the support available is clearly mapped out. We also aim to achieve a clear way to help children/young people who have challenging behaviour and need support. We are also going to agree and embed supportive language, for example, the results from the latest autism terminology consultation revealed that calling people autistic is preferred by autistic people and their families. Therefore, we are advocating for this language to be used in all organisations. including the NHS and Local authority.

We are also looking to improve existing courses for parents to better suit the needs of neurodiverse families, pilot a multi-agency assessment triage and establish a mechanism which identifies schools who need support

Sensory Processing group

The Sensory processing group is currently working on designing the support available in south Cumbria for children and young people who have sensory processing difficulties and their families.

We are creating this for children and young people who need to access support at a universal, targeted and specialist level. Universal level means for children and young people who need support by changing their environment and low-level reasonable adjustments, targeted support means those children and young people who need input from a professional and much more adjustments made. Specialist level means those who have significant sensory needs and need a much higher amount of support and specialist advice.

Key Updates on some of our current work









Cumberland & Westmorland and Furness Local offer groups



We are currently redesigning both the Westmorland and furness and Cumberland Local offers, Making sure it is accessible so that it is easy to understand and jargon free, making it Comprehensive – all those that use the website should know what support is available. We are going to ensure it is all up to date with no broken links. we will also ensure it is supportive and informative and has the information on there that families want!

we are also going to make sure it meets the statutory duties as outlined in the SEND Code of Practice, and childrens and families act. As well as ensuring it is easy for parent carers to process and digest the information on there and overall, make It look less boring and accessible!

Trust and faith group

On the trust and faith group we are currently creating lived experience impact training videos which is going to be a series of modules containing videos that professionals have to undertake. These professionals will involve therapists, educational psychologists, school staff etc.

These videos are going to be parents speaking about their experiences during certain processes so we will have negative experiences and positive experiences, where families will discuss how it made them feel, what could have been done better, the affect it has had on them and their children etc. We hope this will create an impact to professionals demonstrating how it makes people who are actually on the ground feel. Something which a lot of professionals don't have experience with. We hope this will ensure professionals can learn from best practise, and the difference that has made to families, as well as learning, how much mistakes and not handling situations well can impact children and their families.

SENDAC are the starting to create an 'EHCP pack' alongside professional for parents to have right at the start of the process that will explain everything about the EHCP process including the process, timeframes and the legalities. We are also challenging the NHS and LA on specificity and quantification in section F.

Why is your feedback important:

SENDAC's job is to take your feedback to senior leads in the NHS and Local authority. Without your feedback, we are unable to make changes to services and unable to tell them what's not working well for families.

SENDAC reps do not speak their own point of view in meetings, they speak the view of Cumbria-wide parent carers.

Your feedback is so important because it has the power to make changes, the more feedback we have, the more powerful our voice-power in numbers.

Without your feedback, we are not able to make the changes exactly how you want, because we need your feedback to understand what would work best for you and your children.

You as a parent are an expert by experience, you have a perspective that professionals who make the decisions on services do not have, and this needs to be heard by those professionals!


Lived experience training for professionals - designed by parents!

Okay, but what happens when we share our experiences? What happens with it?



Well thats the BEST bit- our experiences will be turned into actual videos to form the training modules. Alongside other bits of training too. These training modules will then be delivered to schools, the local authority, and NHS professionals who work with our kids!

OUR VIDEOS ARE BASICALLY THE TRAINING! IT WILL MAKE A HUGE IMPACT, ITS CALLED "LIVED EXPERIENCED TRAINING"







SENDAC are on a workstream called the 'trust and faith group'. The group consists of professionals from the LA, NHS, SENDIASS and parents and carers (SENDAC). Together we are embarking on an incredible project to create new SEND training modules, called 'Lived Experience' training for the NHS, Local authority, and education settings, and we need YOU (parents and carers) to be a part of it.

We would like this to be a short video series featuring families with children or young adults with SEND telling us about their experiences with health services, council services, education settings, or any other setting that has had an impact- whether that's negative or positive. These videos will then be rolled out and used as tools for training in professional settings, so professionals can hear directly from families who are interacting with them or accessing their services.

This could be any experience that has had an impact on you, your child or young person, or your family - either positive or negative.

Don't want to be on video, what about my experience!?

You have various options:

- you can write a letter/email anonymously or not-completely up to you!
- You can take a video at home
- You can do a voice recording

You can also get your children/ young people involved too. They can write us a letter, create a drawing, or create a voice note or video recording.

SPOTLIGHT

Definition:

ADHD is defined through the analysis of behaviour. People with ADHD show a persistent pattern of inattention and/or hyperactivity-impulsivity that interferes with day-to-day functioning and/or development.



Attention deficit hyperactivity disorder



ADHD is one of a number of different neurodiversities including dyspraxia, dyslexia and autism.

In the UK it's thought that between 2% to 5% of school-aged children have ADHD.


The prevalence of ADHD in the adult population is between 3% and 4% but the majority of these individuals are undiagnosed.

If you think your child may have ADHD you can speak to your doctor, or your child's educational setting and let them know your concerns.

The waiting list for an ADHD diagnosis in Cumbria is significantly long at present, but there are steps you can take to support your child in the meantime.

- Speak to your child's school and talk to them about support in school
- You can help your child with their sensory processing needs by getting them sensory equipment/toys and playing sensorybased games or sensory circuits.
- You could help your child with organising their time by setting reminders or providing a visual checklist of things that need to be done i.e. their morning routine- brush teeth, get dressed,
- You could break down instructions or sentences into small chunks giving them time to process the information that is being said.



Myths and facts:

X Girls don't experience hyperactivity



People with ADHD can **never** focus

some people with ADHD can focus and some people with ADHD actually hyper focus too.

X ADHD is caused by poor parenting

The cause for ADHD is not known, although, a combination of factors is thought to possibly be responsible, such as, genetics and brain function and structure.

Boys with ADHD have more needs than girls with ADHD

Both boys and girls with ADHD can have the same amount of needs.

If they were diagnosed as an adult it can't impact their lives that much

later in life for a variety of reasons such as,
ADHD symptoms not being fully understood,
children masking symptoms, symptoms being
more prominent in adulthood when routines
are less structured than they were in school,
ADHD symptoms becoming more obvious when
people try and live independently.

This is not true, some people are diagnosed

Westmorland & Furness Parent reps needed!


Being a Parent Rep for SENDAC means that you can help improve SEND services in Cumbria. SENDAC parent reps have a choice of how much time they would like to give to the forum, but we do ask that they attend our forum meetings every 4 weeks on a Wednesday at 6:45-8:15 pm online Via Microsoft Teams, obviously unless you can't make it certain weeks for whatever reason- we are hoping to reduce how often we meet in the future. These meetings are solely for our SENDAC forum committee members- who are all parent carers themselves (there are 16 of us at the moment) They're very informal, so if there are children in the background or you're finishing your tea etc, it's not a problem at all!. We discuss SENDAC as a whole, give updates on our current work and discuss our aims and ideas.

We then have other work Parent Reps can take on and they can choose if they would like to participate in these or not- the idea is you can give as much or as little time as you can taking into account your personal circumstances and availability etc. These tasks include:

Local Government Restructure...

Goodbye Cumbria SEND partnership!

In April 2023, a Local Government Reorganisation took place in Cumbria, and Cumberland Council and Westmorland and Furness Council replaced Cumbria County Council.

This means, those who live in the districts:

Carlisle, Allerdale and Copeland districts now come under Cumberland council.

Eden, South Lakes and Barrow now come Under Westmorland and Furness council.

so, what does this mean for Cumbria SEND partnership?

Firstly, Cumbria SEND partnership was made up of three independent, equal partners which include the NHS, the Local authority and SENDAC, the statutory parent carer forum.

All of the organisations are independent of one another, however, work in partnership to improve SEND services, by redesigning SEND services together. With the Local Authority giving their point of view, the NHS giving a health point of view and SENDAC giving a parent carer point of view-including challenging opinions of the NHS and Local authority if we think they're not in the best interests of parents and young people in Cumbria with SEND.

So following LGR, the SEND Partnership continued to operate county-wide. However, as of January 2024, they have split into two.

Cumbria SEND partnership is now being replaced with two separate partnerships - the Westmorland and Furness SEND partnership and the Cumberland SEND partnership.

Both Partnerships will continue to consist of professionals from their relevant councils (either Cumberland or Westmorland and Furness), NHS and Health colleagues, and SENDAC, the statutory parent and carer forum.
